The SFERA-III project addresses advanced science challenges and integrated research activities in the field of Concentrating Solar Thermal (CST) technology by integrating key European research infrastructures (RIs) into an ambitious wide project aiming at offering to a new level of high-quality services by:

1. Increasing and spreading the scientific and technological knowledge in the CST field.
2. Promoting the long-term sustainability of the integrated RIs, and developing synergies and complementary capabilities among them, aiming to develop the European Research Area.
3. Providing high-quality RIs and advanced services that enable European researchers from academia and industry to conduct first-class experimental research focusing on CST-related activities (i.e., thermal storage systems, water desalination, water treatment, solar fuel production, materials for solar receivers and STE components, linear systems and point focusing systems) and other high temperature / high flux applications.
4. Educating new researchers to the appropriate use of the RIs.
5. Fostering the access of industrial researchers to RIs.
6. Enhancing the innovation potential and effectiveness of the RIs by developing new standards and protocols, thus improving their relevance for the industry.
7. Promoting the exploitation of CST-related know-how and technologies (e.g., materials treatments and characterisation techniques) in other fields with an interdisciplinary approach.
8. Supporting the creation of an e-infrastructure providing remote access to the European R&D centres active in the field of CST-related technologies.

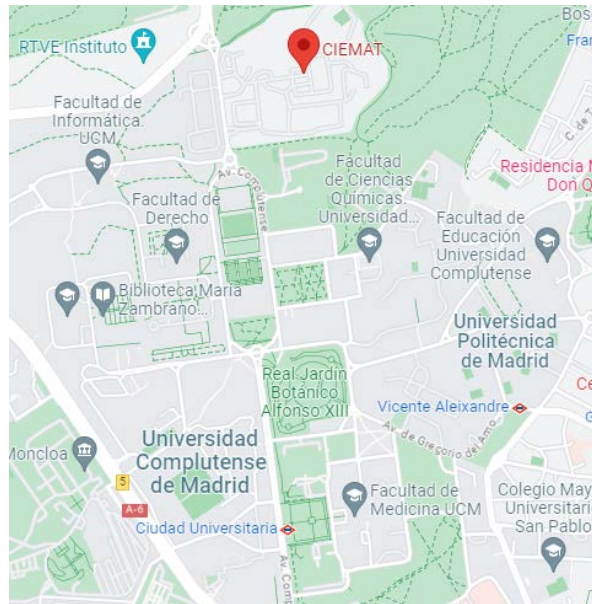

By car

- CIEMAT has its own free car parking.

- From M-30: exit Sinesio Delgado, direction Ciudad Universitaria-CIEMAT.

- By bus





- **Línea 82. Paraninfo-CIEMAT stop.** This is the best way to get to CIEMAT from Moncloa. The starting point of the bus line is at Meléndez Valdés, 72.
- Lines **F** (exit from Cuatro Caminos), **G** and **U** (exit from Moncloa), all of them stop at Paraninfo-Telecomunicaciones.

- **By underground**

- **From the Barajas airport, line 8 “Barajas-Aeropuerto”.** Please, note that there are two different stops: one from terminals T1-2-3 and another for T4. Be sure the terminals T1, T2, T3, and T4 are also connected by shuttle service. For reaching CIEMAT from the airport, use line 8, stop at “Nuevos Ministerios” station to get the line 6 towards “Ciudad Universitaria” station.
- **From the “Ciudad Universitaria” metro station, line 6,** once reached the Ciudad Universitaria metro station, follow **the itinerary attached to reach CIEMAT.**
